- University and technological education. Currently trying to unify to one level of nursing education 4 year programme
- 11 million population in Greece
- 20,000 nurse in Greece [need at least 60,000]
- 60,000 doctors in Greece
- Nursing carers either employed by patient or via insurance to stay with the patient, especially at night
- Government has recognised the need to increase the number of nurses but reducing public expenditure.
- Paediatric Nursing 1 year training [other formal specialities Medical, surgical and psychiatric]. Education programme 500/1,000 hours theory/practice
- Organise conferences and study days. Annual congress
- 150 nurses with PhD [8 paediatric nurses]; professors in paediatric nursing x 1
