Who specialises in what?

- 126,000 active nurses
- (76,000 active nurses in Flanders)
- 17% of nurses in Belgium have a specialisation
- 8 accredited areas of specialisation in nursing:
- diabetes care
- o operative care
- o palliative care
- o mental health care
- paediatrics and neonatology (exact number unknown)
- oncology
- o geriatrics
- emergency / intensive care







Legal obligations of paediatric departments in hospitals



What % of specialists is required on the paediatric ward?

Art. 28. § 1. There must be sufficient nursing staff, suited in number and qualification to the nature and volume of the patients' problems.

§ 2. At least 75 % of the nursing and care staff working in the care programme must consist of paediatric nurses, holding a bachelor's degree in nursing with a specialisation in paediatrics.

§ 3. **There must be at least one nurse** belonging to the 75% of qualified nurses mentioned in the previous paragraph present on the ward **24 hours a day**.

Attractiveness and remuneration of a specialisation in paediatric nursing





Keeping the profession attractive isn't easy in Belgium either!

- All nurses in Belgium are paid on an equal pay scale (IFIC).
- Distinction between nurses with a bachelor's degree and specialised nurses (higher pay grade).
- BUT!! The nurses on paediatric wards are not paid according to the pay scale for specialist nurses in Belgium. The Belgian government has not recognised these wards as ones to which higher pay is allocated. (2015)
- This contradicts the slide we just saw, which clearly embeds the need for specialisation in the law.
- HOWEVER, in 2022: introduction of a bonus of 150 euros/month.
